

THREE YEAR SEQUENCE FOR PSYCHOLOGY

The psychology program provides excellent preparation for careers in mental health, child development, psychological research, human resources, education, and more. This major is also a strong choice if you plan to pursue graduate school in psychology or related fields, such as law, social work or physical therapy. Compared to other regional colleges or universities, Mount students have won more regional and national awards for exceptional research from Psi Chi (the national honor society in psychology.)

PREREQUISITE

PSY 103 must be taken in the summer term prior to beginning fall classes.

YEAR 1
