For graduates awarded degrees in August 2015, December 2015, & May 2016 Survey results as of February 21, 2017

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# 2015 - 2016 EMPLOYMENT SURVEY SUMMARY REPORT

#### **CHANGES TO THE SURVEY:**

In an effort to bring the 2015-2016 Graduate Employment Survey in line with the <u>National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE)</u> standards and protocols, prior years surveys were studied and changes were instituted to the survey questions for this year. The most significant changes are:

- Graduates are asked to describe their primary status after graduation and may only select one category. In prior years, graduates were asked to select all categories that applied. Therefore, all responses add up to 100%.
- The success rate is replaced by the career outcomes rate. The career outcomes rate does not distinguish between professional and non-professional positions and includes part time positions.
- The response rate is now called the knowledge rate. This is change in the title only; the definition remains the same.
- All rates are calculated based on the number of graduates, not the number of majors.

Due to the changes in survey questions, some areas of the survey are not able to be compared directly to prior surveys. In these instances, both current and prior data are included and differences are noted.

### **SURVEY METHOD:**

The 2015 - 2016 Employment Survey represents graduates awarded degrees in August 2015, December 2015, and May 2016. This report showcases the employment status of graduates as of February 21, 2017.

All graduates were contacted by email 4 times and asked to complete the survey. The CEEC reviewed graduates' LinkedIn profiles to determine employment. Faculty was then asked to provide data for graduates from their programs (if known) and CEEC staff provided updates on graduates they worked with throughout the survey period. Multiple attempts were made by the CEEC to contact each "no response" by phone (173 students). All graduates' records are updated in CARS. Other information, such as Further Study, is stored on the final report. All Deans and department chairs receive the Summary Report, the Associate, Bachelor, Master's and Doctorate spreadsheets, and a list of graduates from their department with specific employment information.

# **SURVEY RESULTS:**

# **Bachelor Degrees (N= 331):**

This year's knowledge rate (formerly, the response rate) was 86.4%.

For the Class of 2016, the career outcomes rate (Full Time + Part Time + Further Study + Volunteer/Service + Military Service) is **95.1%** Graduates who participated in co-op, had a career outcomes rate of **97.6%**.

Upon further review, the number of graduates employed in Full-time positions is **72.4**%, an increase from last year's 64.6% (Includes professional and non-professional positions. The number of students seeking further education dropped to 11.5% of the graduating class, compared with 19.2% last year.

# **Cooperative Education**

This year the percentage of co-op students who held off-campus positions (did not co-op at the Mount) and accepted employment from their co-op employer was **26.4%**. The percent of co-op students that accepted employment from any co-op employer (including the Mount) was **20.7%**. Overall, **27.8%** of the graduating class participated in co-op compared to 33.4% of last year's class.

- Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center (CCHMC) hired 4 graduates this year in various majors.
- The Cincinnati Reds hired 1 graduate and the Cincinnati Reds Hall of Fame and Museum also hired 1 graduate.

Other hospital employers (hiring mostly nursing majors); Tri Health 2, The Christ Hospital 2, and Mercy Health 2.

# Of the graduating class:

- 27.8% of the graduates participated in co-op compared to 33.4% in 2015.
- 42.9% of the Traditional Age graduates co-oped compared to last year at 41.9%.
- 5.3% of the Adult Learners co-oped compared to 13.0% in 2015.
- 21.7% of all graduates who co-op are pursuing further study compared to 26.3% in 2015 and 28.9% in 2014.

#### Of the co-op class:

- 92.4% of the Co-ops were Traditional Age compared to 88.6% in 2015.
- 7.6% of the Co-ops were Adult Learners compared to 11.4% in 2015.

Of the co-ops who responded to the survey:

- 63.9% had a full time position compared to 72.4% overall.
- 21.7% of graduates went on to pursue further study compared to 11.5% overall.
- Only 1 graduate indicated he/she is still seeking employment.
- The Career Outcomes Rate is 97.6% compared to 95.1% overall.

9 students who co-oped did not respond to the survey.

# **Other Interesting Co-op Facts:**

Accounting – 5 of 8 graduates participated in co-op; 3 are employed full time; 2 are continuing their education.

**Biology** – 10 of 16 graduates participated; 4 are employed full time; 4 are continuing their education, and 2 did not respond.

**Business Administration** – 11 of 32 grads participating; 9 are employed full time, 1 is working part time, and 3 are attending grad schools.

Nursing – 6 of 51 graduates co-oped. All are employed full time.

**Psychology** – 4 of 17 graduates co-oped. 2 reported full time employment, 1 is working in a volunteer program and 1 is attending grad school.

**Sport Management** - 11 of 13 graduates participated in co-op. 7 reported full time employment, 1 reported part time employment, 2 are attending graduate school, and 1 did not respond.

# Associate Degrees (N=6):

The knowledge rate was 50% (3 out of 6 graduates) compared to 100% (5 out of 5 graduates) in 2015.

The career outcomes rate (Full Time + Part Time + Further Study + Volunteer/Service + Military Service) adds up to 100%.

# **Graduate Degrees (N=191):**

The career outcomes rate (Full Time + Part Time + Further Study + Volunteer/Service + Military Service) adds up to 98.1%

The knowledge rate decreased this year to **82.2%** as compared to 87.6% in 2015.

- 14 of 14 MBA graduates responded and 12 are employed in full-time profession positions while 2 are still seeking.
- 7 of 8 graduates in the Religious Studies program responded and 100% are working in a full time position.
- 91.3% (21 of 23) of students graduating in the Education program responded and all are employed in full-time positions.
- 11 of 13 students graduating in the Master of Nursing Clinical Track program responded and all are employed in full-time positions.
- 93.5% of Physical Therapy graduates responded and 96.6% (28 of 31 graduates) are working in full-time positions and one is working in part time position.
- Both (2of 2) Health System Leadership Track graduates responded and are working in full time positions.
